

Requirements for Admission as a Transfer Student

Bachelor of Science – Digital Arts and Sciences (DAS)

Transfer students meeting the minimum requirements listed below will be *considered* for admission to the University of Florida, Department of Computer and Information Science and Engineering (CISE) in pursuit of a Bachelor of Science in Digital Arts and Science. Note that admission is *highly competitive* due to a limited number of admission slots.

Requirements vary depending on the student's institution.

Minimum Requirements for Consideration for Transfer Admission:

- 1) - Florida public community/state college: 60 or more transferable hours + Assoc. of Arts degree
- Florida public university or regionally accredited institution: 60 or more transferable semester hours
- Florida nonpublic postsecondary institution: 60 transferable semester hours in Florida Statewide Course Numbering System

- 2) Overall GPA of 2.0 or higher

- 3) Completion of 6* of the 8 Critical Tracking courses w/C or better *at time of application*:

○ MAC2311 or equiv.	Calculus and Analytical Geometry I	4 credits
○ MAC2312 or equiv.	Calculus and Analytical Geometry II	4 credits
○ MAC2313 or equiv.	Calculus and Analytical Geometry III	4 credits
○ MAP2302 or equiv.	Differential Equations	3 credits
○ PHY2048 or equiv.	Physics w/ Calculus I	3 credits
+PHY2048L or equiv.	Physics I lab	1 credit
○ PHY2049 or equiv.	Physics w/ Calculus II	3 credits
+PHY2049L or equiv.	Physics II lab	1 credit
○ CHM2045 or equiv.	General Chemistry	3 credits
+CHM2045L or equiv.	Chemistry lab	1 credit
○ ARH2051 or equiv.	Art History II	3 credits

-PHY2048 & PHY2048L must be one of the minimum six completed tracking courses.

-Although labs are required as part of Critical Tracking, they are not computed in the Critical Tracking GPA.

- 4) Combined Critical Tracking GPA of 2.5 throughout the completion of all eight tracking courses

* No more than two tracking courses can be repeated, no more than two attempts.

* First attempts less than a C will not count in tracking GPA as long as a grade of C or better is earned in the second attempt.

Note: a dropped course (W) counts as an unsuccessful attempt.

Only students who satisfy the minimum requirements will be considered for conditional acceptance into the Digital Arts and Sciences program. All conditionally accepted transfer students are required to complete their remaining Critical Tracking courses during their first term of enrollment at UF. It is **HIGHLY** recommended that students finish all eight Critical Tracking courses prior to their first term of enrollment at UF.
